**STEWARDSHIP OUR GIFTS: WHO ARE YOU FOLLOWING? November 18th:** We have a saying that "all good things must come to an end." As we prepare for Advent, we must note that our church year has come to an end. The apocalyptic nature of today's readings should cause us to reflect on this ending. Mark's Gospel tells us we will "see 'the Son of Man coming in the clouds' with great power and glory, and then he will send out the angels and gather his elect from the four winds, from the end of the earth to the end of the sky." I think most of us agree that we want to be part of this "elect" that Mark mentions. How do we ensure that we are marked for that day? We begin with baptism, which is a public declaration of our acceptance of Jesus Christ as the Son of God and as our redeem- er. But we have to remember the words of the apostle Paul: Faith without works is dead. In baptism we are called into a life of discipleship. We are called to live out our faith in every word and deed of every day. Next week we celebrate commitment Sunday, when you will have an opportunity to recommit yourself as a disciple of Jesus Christ. Take a quiet moment this week to reflect on the end of this liturgical year and the beginning of a new one. How will you allow your- self to become fully alive in discipleship in the coming year?

**November 25th:** Today we celebrate the feast of Christ the King. All three readings today describe, in some way, the kingship of Jesus Christ. Throughout the Bible, we are given many other images of Jesus: the Good Shepherd, the Son of God, the miracle man, the carpenter's son, etc. Most of these images depict Jesus as humble and peaceful. But Christ the King is different. He a mighty king, robed in splendor and he has received everlasting dominion and glo- ry. It easy to get caught up in how AWESOME our king is, but He is still humble and peaceful at heart. He is a king who serves His people, and He wants the same from us. Jesus dwells within us, and His kingship is fulfilled when we serve one another. Serving Jesus as our king means loving Him with all our being, obeying His com- mandments, and caring for the least of his people. As we commit ourselves to a new year of the stewardship way of life, let us remember that we can best live out our discip- le-ship by recognizing Christ the King in one another, serving each other the way He would have us do so.
